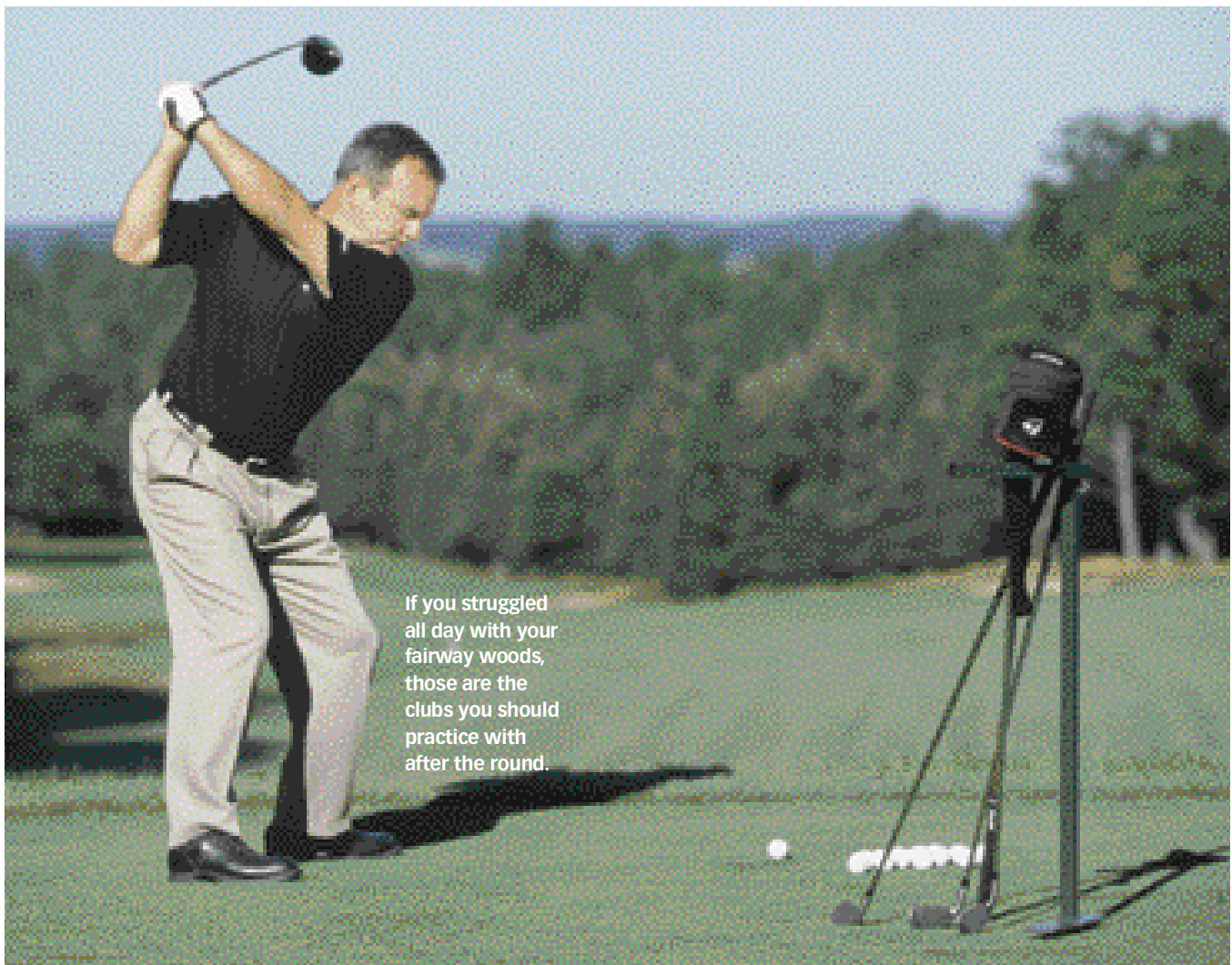




# Rick's Practice Tips

When to work on your game, and what to focus on



If you struggled all day with your fairway woods, those are the clubs you should practice with after the round.

**T**he best time to practice golf is right after a round. Try to remember the shots and clubs that gave you the most trouble during the round. Those are the ones you should practice. Think of the situations that gave you fits—maybe it was your

3-wood from the fairway or the 50-yard pitch—and work on that shot until you make three good swings in a row. You don't have to hit 300 balls after a round. But if you don't practice those shots, you'll never have the confidence to execute them. It would be

like getting straight A's in math but failing history. Which subject should you spend more time studying? 🏌️
